





#### HISTORY OF THE ANTON GRALL FARM



The Anton Grall Farm was passed down from Anton Grall to son John Grall who married Louisa Kuehnl Grall (1899) and Anna Grimm Sickinger Grall (1919). John passed the farm down to his youngest child, Germaine Grall Tuschl and her husband, Anthony. Their children, Chuck, Ken, and Donna grew up on the farm.

The address of the house is currently 10817 US Highway 10, Cato, WI 54230. Located on the south side of Highway 10, on the east side of Whitelaw, the house, barns, and five acres were sold after the death of Germaine Grall Tuschl in 1998. The farm had been under the ownership of the descendants of Anton and Mary Grall for about 150 years. The remaining 100 acres continues to be owned by Chuck and Ken Tuschl. (2018)

In the 1960's Tony and Germaine renovated the house. It no longer looks like the original farmhouse seen in the photo with the Anton Grall Family. The sturdy barn still stands a testament to quality construction and continued attention to maintenance and preservation.

Germaine loved the farm. She was happiest when she was caring for the cows, tending to the garden, cooking and nurturing her family. A neighbor recalled knowing Germaine when she was a child and wrote a poignant letter:



I know all the Gralls of Whitelaw. I remember seeing an old lady and man at the Grall Farm, (Anton and Mary Lemberger Grall) who lived in part of the farm house. I knew the mother (Louisa Kuehnl Grall) died when Edmund was a baby, and I knew Mayme and walked to school with her. Then one summer us 7th graders had to come to a Saturday wedding mass to sing; and little Mayme was reluctant to be friends with the new stepmother, as we watched on the church steps; her dad (John Grall) married Ms. Sickinger (Anna Grimm Sickinger Grall), this was after the nuptial mass. It was a good marriage, and I remember Germaine; and one day we passed a large load of hay, and on-top John Sr. (John Grall 1877-1961) with a little girl Germaine holding the horses, and he pretending that she was really driving



Left: Hirschau, West Bohemia [Hyršov, Všeruby, Czech Republic] located in the Bohemian Forest, was populated with Bavarian Germans before World War I. This small hamlet, located a few miles from the Germany-Czech border, currently struggles to survive after living under Communist rule for almost half a century. Many Grall ancestors were born here.

Hirschau lHyršov], and Fuchsberg were home to many Grall ancestors. Many of the immigrants to the Whitelaw area claimed to be from Hirschau. There is even a road named Hirschau Road near Whitelaw.

Bob Pritzl also states that Anton Grall had two brothers or half-brothers who immigrated to Wisconsin. The evidence is convincing but no definite proof has been found indicating this to be true. Bob, who passed away in 2009, did not identify the parents of Anton, Johann or George Grall.

<u>Johann Grall</u> (1833-1904) married Barbara Seidl (1837-1913). They owned a farm in the Whitelaw area. Their only son, Ignatz Grall (1867-1949), also farmed in the Whitelaw area.

George Grall (1824-1893) married to Theresia Mayer Grall (1828-1914). George farmed in Kossuth, Manitowoc County, WI until his retirement. George and Theresia retired to Antigo, Langlade County, WI, where they lived with a daughter and her husband.

## MARY LEMBERGER GRALL (1846-1931)

MRS. A. GRALL SR. RESIDENT FOR 72 YEARS, DIES

Mrs. Mary Grall, 86, widow of the late Anton Grall, Sr., and a pioneer resident of Whitelaw passed away there on Wednesday. The deceased whose maiden name was Mary Lemberger, was born in Germany in 1846 and came to this country with her parents when a girl of twelve. The family settled in this county and she was married here to Anton Grall and they located on a farm near Whitelaw. Her husband was a Civil War veteran and he passed away thirteen years ago.

Three daughters, Mrs. Joseph Kohlbeck, Marshfield, Mrs. John Staudinger, Whitelaw and Mrs. William Brunner of this city and four sons, Joseph, Anton, John and Wolfgang, all of Whitelaw survive. There are also 38 grandchildren and 29 great grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held Saturday morning at 9:30 from the St. Michael's church in Whitelaw with interment in the cemetery there.



#### JOSEPH GRALL DIES ON FARM

Whitelaw Man Dies On Farm Where He Was Born

Joseph Grall, 66, life-long resident of the county, died Friday night at the homestead farm near Whitelaw. He had been in failing health for some weeks.

The deceased was born on the homestead farm in 1867 and was married there 37 years ago to Mary Zipperer who survives him with eight children, Mrs. Godfrey Schuh and Mrs. Anton Meyer, Whitelaw, Mrs. John Braun, city, Mrs. Harvey Kohlbeck, Cato, and Edward, Paul, Alfred and Marcella at home. Three brothers, Anton, Wolfgang and John, all of Whitelaw, and three sisters, Mrs. William Brunner, Mrs. John Staudinger, Whitelaw, and Mrs. Joseph Kohlbeck, Marshfield, also survive.

Funeral services will be held Monday at 9 a.m. from the home and at 9:30 a.m. from St. Michael's church at Whitelaw, with burial in the adjoining cemetery. The remains are now at the homestead near Whitelaw.

**Note**: Anton Grall did not purchase the Whitelaw farmland until 1870. The family was believed to be living near Francis Creek/French Creek/Kossuth area at the time Joseph would have been born.

#### MARY ZIPPERER GRALL (1874-1961)

Mrs. Mary Grall, 86, a former Whitelaw resident, died at 4:15 p.m. Wednesday at St. Mary Home for the Aged, Manitowoc, where she had resided six years. She had been in ill health for three weeks.

Funeral services will be at 9:15 a.m. Saturday at Pfeffer Funeral Home, Manitowoc, and at 10 a.m. at St. Michael Catholic Church, Whitelaw, The Rev. Francis Rose officiating. Burial will be in the church cemetery.

Mrs. Grall was born Mary Zipperer Dec. 8, 1874, in Germany, daughter of the late George and Theresa Seidl Zipperer. She came to this county at an early age with her family and was married to Joseph Grall Oct. 28, 1894, at St. Michael Church, Whitelaw.

She lived on a farm near Whitelaw until 1950 when she moved to the Village of Whitelaw, where she resided until 1954. Her husband preceded her in death Feb. 22, 1933. Also preceding her in death were two daughters, four brothers, a sister and a grandchild. Mrs. Grall was a charter member of the Christian Mothers Altar Society of St. Michael Church.

Survivors include five daughters, Mrs. Godfrey Schuh, Mrs. Anton Meyer and Mrs. Harvey Kohlbeck of Whitelaw, Mrs. John Braun and Mrs. Ben Kohlbeck of Manitowoc; three sons, Edward of Marinette, Alfred of Whitelaw and Paul of Manitowoc; 25 grandchildren and 25 great-grandchildren.

Friends may call after 3 p.m. Friday at the funeral home, where the Rosary will be recited at 8 p.m. by the Christian Mothers Altar Society and members of the parish.

#### ANTON GRALL RITES FRIDAY

Lifelong Resident of Whitelaw Was 65 Years Old

Anton Grall, 65, a lifelong resident of Whitelaw, died Wednesday after nine weeks' illness. Funeral services will be held Friday at 9 a.m. from the St. Michael's Catholic Church, Whitelaw, with interment in the adjoining cemetery.

The deceased was born in Whitelaw and was married there in 1893 to Theresia Fischer. He took up the trade of a cabinet maker, which he followed until his death. Survivors are his wife, four sons, Joseph, Manitowoc; Charles, Whitelaw; George and Erwin, Los Angeles, Calif.; two brothers; three sisters and 10 grandchildren.

The body had been removed to the home in Whitelaw from the Kochan funeral home and may be viewed there until Friday morning.

## Haibühl, Cham, Bayern (Bavaria), Germany

The Lemberger families originate in Bayern, the former province of Bavaria, in southeastern Germany, near the current Czech Republic. The family came from the neighboring villages of Lam, Haibühl and Thürnstein, all within three miles of each other. The Regen River flows from the Bohemian Forest through this area, traveling 100 miles to where it empties into the Danube River at Regensburg, Germany.

The surname Lemberger is a place name, likely originating from the village of Lamberg, which is located about 2 miles from Haibühl where the family was documented as living. There is also a mountain village

named Lambach, and an even smaller village named Lamberg. Both villages are within 2 miles of Lam, a municipality of about 3,000 inhabitants in the district of Cham in Bavaria in Germany.


